As we start the **spring term**, our focus is on giving every child the best possible start. **Regular attendance is key** – it helps children learn, build confidence, and stay connected with their friends.

➡ Getting Back into Bedtime Routines

After the holidays, routines can take a little time to re-establish. Try these ideas:

- ✅ **Set a consistent bedtime and wake-up time** – helps children feel rested and ready for school
- ✅ **Switch off screens at least an hour before bed** – reading a story or a warm bath can help children relax
- ✅ **Create a “wind-down” routine:** bath, story, lights out – consistency helps children settle and sleep well

Tip Box: A calm bedtime routine now = a happy, alert child in class tomorrow!



📅 Other Tips for a Smooth Start

- **Prepare the night before:** Lay out uniforms, pack bags, and plan lunches
- **Keep mornings positive:** A healthy breakfast and calm routine set the day up right
- **Stay connected:** Ask about your child's day and celebrate even small successes
