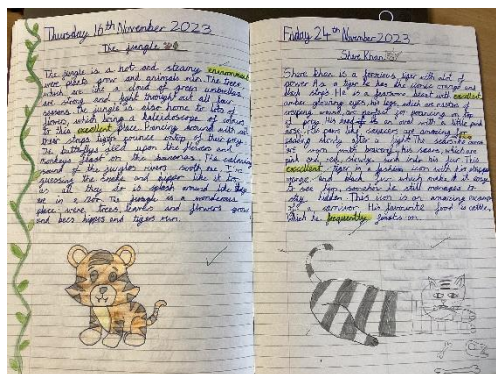


Autumn 2 - Year 5

It's been another busy half term in Year 5!



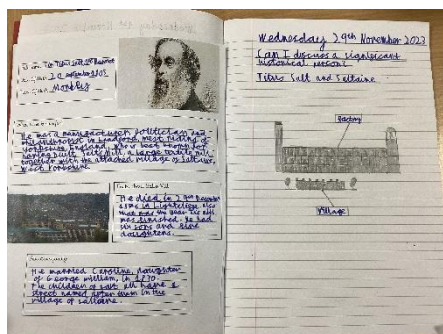

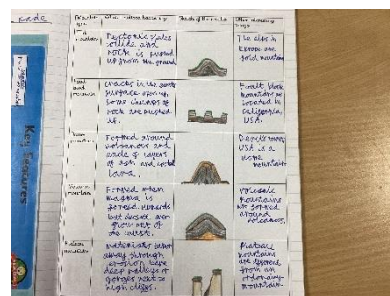
